# AN INPUT TO A FRAMEWORK FOR AFRICAN-CUBAN SOLIDARITY

The framework outlined above provides pathways for African countries and progressive movements to move from constrained positions toward genuine sovereignty, while simultaneously strengthening Cuba's position through solidarity and mutual development.
